Did you know?

 According to the FCC, 1.3% of Beaufort County households live in an area where no there is no ISP offering wired or licensed fixed wireless broadband plans with speeds of at least 100/20 Mbps.

Did you know?

 Almost 5,500 Beaufort County households (6%) were beneficiaries of the federal ACP broadband subsidy program when it ended in June 2024.

Did you know?

• 33% of low-income households have a desktop or laptop in the home, 15% have only a smartphone, and 7% have no device at all. For individuals who don't speak English, 45% have no desktop or laptop, 29% have only a smartphone, and 13% have no device at all.

What is the Digital Divide?

People who have access to technology, the internet, and digital skills



Digital divide is the issue.

Digital equity is the goal.

Digital inclusion is the work.

THE DIVIDE

People who do NOT have access to technology, the internet, and digital skills



Digital Equity and Access in South Carolina



- **Affordability:** Of the 27% of South Carolina households that report that their internet **does not meet their current needs**, 55% say that their internet service is **too expensive**. Of the 24% of South Carolina households that report that they do not have home internet but would like to, 57% say that the cost is too high.
- Access: Almost 13,300 households in Beaufort County (15%) have no desktop or laptop.
 Almost 7,500 households (9%) have only a smartphone, and almost 2,300 (3%) have no device at all.
- Digital Skills: More than 5% of individuals surveyed by the University of South Carolina report that they do not feel confident in their ability to use the internet, and almost 6% report that they do not feel safe using the internet.



Guiding Principles



- 1. Living on the wrong side of the digital divide is not a game. These are everyday struggles often experienced by real people.
- 2. Digital equity is fundamental to modern life.
- 3. Awareness is just the first step. Change requires action, and we can make more change by working together.
- 4. People affected by the digital divide are the experts.
- 5. The digital divide is always evolving. Technology continues to advance, and we must be flexible to adapt to these advances as the goal posts move.
